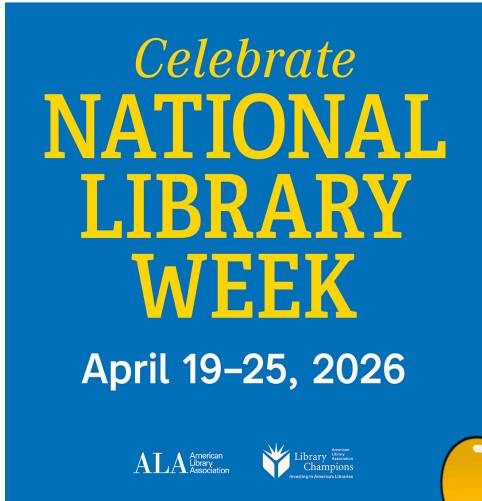

Celebrate @SCPL



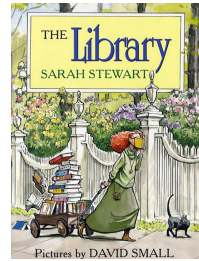
National Library Week is an annual celebration highlighting the valuable role libraries, librarians, and library workers play in transforming lives and strengthening our communities.

In the mid-1950s, concerned that Americans were reading less, the American Library Association and the American Book Publishers created the National Book Committee to encourage reading during Americans' growing leisure time.

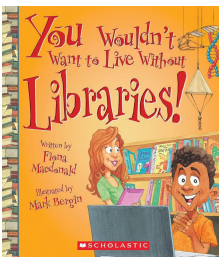
In 1957, the committee launched National Library Week to motivate people to read and support libraries. The first National Library Week was held in 1958 with the theme "Wake Up and Read!"

The 2026 theme, "Find Your Joy," is an invitation for people of all backgrounds to explore and discover what sparks joy in them at the library.

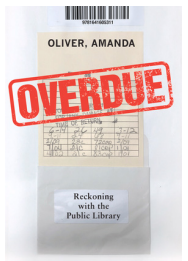

LIBRARY NEWS PAGES OF OUR PAST

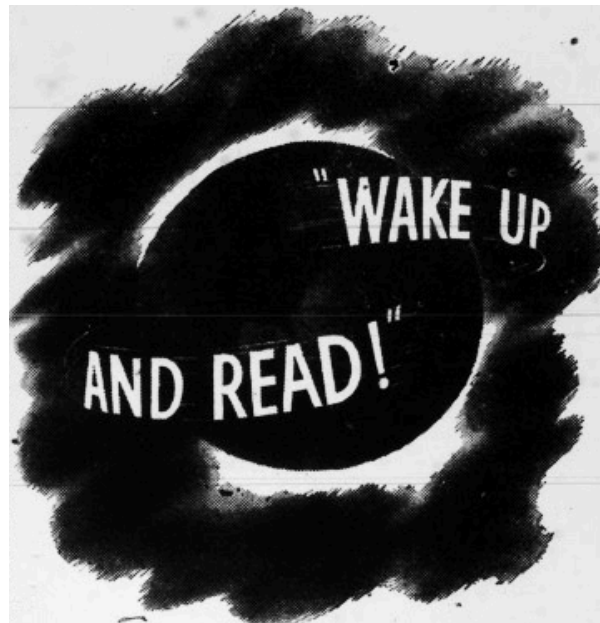
The Scott County Public Library's first Library Week celebration was held in March of 1958 and had strong community participation, especially the county-wide search for the oldest books.

Standout items included:

- a Bible from 1674, brought in by Rev. William J. Engbers
- an 1816 English Bible belonging to Daniel McVey
- an 1824 Indiana law book from Scottsburg attorney Lealand West
- an 1800 storybook brought in by Mr. J.A. Mohler
- an 1824 hymnal from Mrs. Emma Cravens

Early school materials—like McGuffey readers, spellers, and an 1816 arithmetic—were also displayed.

The library featured additional exhibits, including student poster contest winners, artwork, and paintings of Alaskan life. Special events included a film showing, an open house, and waived overdue fines during the week.

Library Week Activities

Big Response To Search For Oldest Books

The search for the oldest books in the County by the Lambda Chi Society and the Scott County Library as part of the National Library Week Observance met with such enthusiasm by the Public and many interesting books have been submitted.

Among the many old books on display is the oldest Bible which is dated 1674 and brought in by Rev. William J. Engbers of the Catholic Church. The oldest English translation of the Bible on display belongs to Daniel McVey of Austin. It is dated 1816. Lealand West, Scottsburg Attorney has the oldest law book which is dated 1824 and is the revised statutes of the Indiana General Assembly in its eighth session held at Corydon, Ind. The oldest dictionary submitted is a Latin dictionary dated 1851 which was brought in by Mrs. Pearl McClain.

Christian, Methodist and Presbyterian Hymnal is exhibited with the oldest being the Presbyterian hymnal brought in by Mrs. Emma Cravens. It is dated 1824.

Many interesting textbooks used in the early schools of the Co. are also displayed. Among them are arithmetics, grammars, geography, history, spellers and a complete set of McGuffey readers. The oldest school book submitted is an Arithmetic dated 1816, belonging to Mrs. W. T. Jennings of Lexington, Ind.

Mr. J. A. Mohler brought in a story book entitled the "Two Shoemakers" which is dated 1800.

The Society and the Library wish to thank the Public for the response to this Library project and invites everyone to visit the Library to see this interesting exhibit.

Winning Posters Also Displayed:

The winning posters in the poster contest sponsored by the P.T.A. organizations of the County are also on display in the Library. First prize was won by Mary Florence Snyder, Seventh Grade student of Scottsburg. Second prize was awarded to Arlene Meyer, Fifth grade student of a Lexington. Third prize went to Joyce Donahue, a fifth grade student of Scottsburg.

Several paintings of Eskimo life done by Mrs. Lawrence Williams, who spent 13 years as a teacher in Alaska, and some oil paintings done by Mrs. John Allen, Art Instructor of the Austin Schools, who recently had a picture accepted by the Hoosier Art Salon at Indianapolis are on exhibit in the Library auditorium.

Mrs. Nicholas announces that fines for overdue books returned during Library Week will be cancelled.

A film, "The Library: A Family Affair" will be shown on Thursday and Friday afternoon at 3:00 P.M.

Library Open House will be held on Saturday, March 22nd, from 1:00 to 5:00 P.M. The Public is invited.

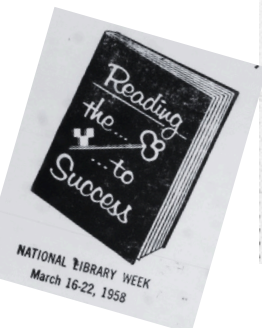
National Library Week Mar. 16-23

The Dumped Truck *Daniel Bernstrom*

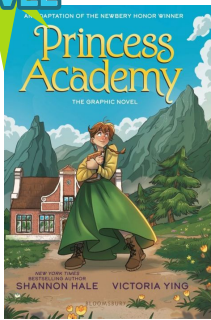
